Thanks for your interest in writing for *The Colorado Magazine!* We are a public history magazine aimed at a broad audience of interested readers. Our articles strive to investigate Colorado's past in order to illustrate something about how we got to now. Our authors focus on storytelling and illustrative examples while maintaining the principles of sound historical research. Clear, concise, non-academic, and direct language is what our readers expect, and our magazine aims to be as engaging to read as it is informative and insightful.

All articles will be published in *The Colorado Magazine Online*, and from there, certain articles will be considered for our print magazine. We accept submissions on a rolling basis.

There is no word limit, though we encourage authors to submit articles between 500 and 5,000 words in length. We do not print citations but will keep that information on file in case of discrepancies. Please do not submit manuscripts with in-text citations, footnotes, or endnotes, but a separate document with these citations would be welcome. Our in-house style guide follows the *Chicago Manual of Style*. Please do not mail hard copies of manuscripts, proposals, or images. History Colorado is not responsible for any loss of materials, and will not return hard-copy manuscripts or photographic materials.

Authors should also plan to submit at least five, high-resolution (at least two megabyte file size) contextual photos. These images should be submitted in .tif, .png, or .jpeg format. Please do not include them in the article document. Photos should be used to help our readers better understand the people, places, and times the article is investigating. In a separate document, please create captions for each of the photos, including a credit line. Authors are responsible for securing permission to use their submitted photos. In some limited cases, History Colorado may be able to pay image use permission fees.

Along with your final draft, please submit a brief (two-sentence maximum) author biography and any author image you would like to publish online with your article. Please also sign and return the attached copyright transfer form.

FAQ:

→ When will my article be published?

- ◆ We accept articles on a rolling basis, so each article's publication date will be different. Our staff will work with you to determine when your article will be ready for publication.

→ Can History Colorado pay me to write for the magazine?

- ◆ In most cases, History Colorado does not offer financial compensation for unsolicited submissions.

→ How long should my article be?

- ◆ We accept articles between 500 and 5000 words. Longer articles will be considered on a case-by-case basis.

→ Should I include footnotes or images in the document?

- ◆ No, please submit images by uploading them to the Google folder your editor will create for you. If you wish to include citations, please do so in a separate document. Do not include footnotes, endnotes, or in-text citations in your submitted manuscript.

→ Can History Colorado provide images to go along with my article?

- ◆ In most cases, we ask that you identify and secure rights for any images you wish to accompany your article. You may use any images from the History Colorado collection free of charge. COPYRIGHT TRANSFER AND PUBLISHING AGREEMENT

This agreement is made between _____, hereinafter the Author, and History Colorado for publication of the manuscript entitled “[TITLE],” along with any accompanying tables, artworks, photographs, or other pertinent material (altogether considered the Work) as follows:

1. The Work is to be published electronically and/or print as an article in History Colorado’s *The Colorado Magazine*.
2. In consideration of the publication of the Work by History Colorado, the Author hereby grants and transfers to History Colorado the right to publish the Work in its present form, to supervise and approve the graphic layout of the Work, and to copyright the Work in the name of History Colorado in *The Colorado Magazine*. It is hereby agreed that the Author otherwise retains exclusive rights to the manuscript for publication in another form.
3. The Author warrants that they are the sole owner of all of the rights in that portion of the Work granted and transferred hereby.
4. It is specifically understood and agreed, unless specified by separate agreement, that no royalties or other monetary consideration shall be paid to the Author by History Colorado under this agreement.
5. History Colorado agrees to provide the Author with four free copies of the Work, and the Author may purchase additional copies at a 40-percent discount price through the Publications office.
