## External Announcement – Internship Opportunity

**Internship Title:** El Pueblo History Museum Camp Program Internship

**Internship Location:** El Pueblo History Museum, Pueblo, CO

**Stipend:** \$4,000. The stipend is not salary or compensation. The stipend is meant to support study and research during the tenure of the appointment.

**Apply By:** May 1, 2026

**Desired Schedule** - This role requires 28 hours per week during the period of June 1 –August 14, 2026 for a total of 300 hours. (Exact schedule to be determined by the intern and their supervisor.)

**Broad Scope of Position:** The intern will support the Hands-On History camp and daycare program by assisting with lesson planning, student supervision, organizational tasks, and team collaboration to deliver engaging enrichment opportunities for elementary school students. This internship provides selected candidates with hands-on experience in the planning and implementation of history camp, daycare, and museum education programming.

Responsibilities include:

- Facilitate educational programming that engages students with the past in interdisciplinary ways.
- Assist the Hands-On History Camp Coordinator and staff in facilitating educational programs and supervising groups of children.
- Learn the summer camp curriculum and perform tasks delegated by the Hands-On History Camp Coordinator.
- Follow and uphold program expectations and rules while maintaining a safe and welcoming environment.
- Collaborate with staff to ensure students are actively engaged and accounted for.
- Perform regular cleaning of the spaces used by the camp and ensure materials and supplies are properly stored and cared for.

**Learning Outcomes:** This internship offers the opportunity to develop foundational skills in education and childcare, including lesson planning, classroom management, and program delivery within a museum setting. Interns interested in pursuing careers in museum education, history, elementary education, or related fields will gain valuable real-world experience working directly with children. This is a highly interactive, hands-on internship.

students, Undergraduate and Graduate Students in Education, History, Anthropology, Museum Studies, Sociology, and Child Development preferred. Must be 18 or older.
